

Sharing Speed with Multiple Connected Devices

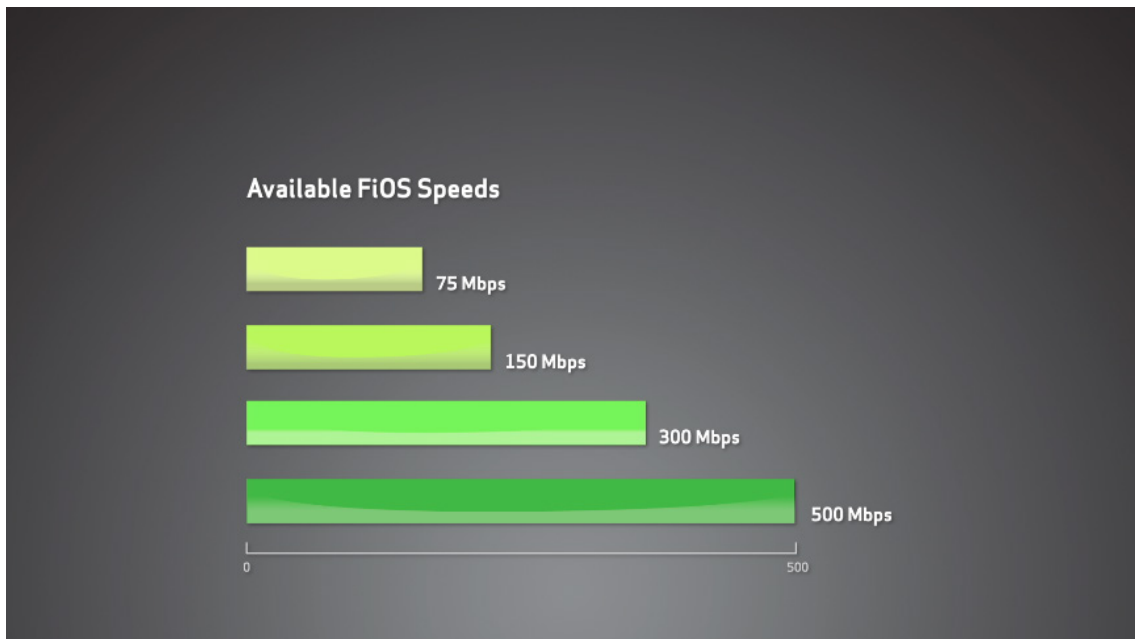
The average US household has seven Internet-connected devices...a number that's growing every year. It's important to realize is that the more devices you have, the more bandwidth you'll need.



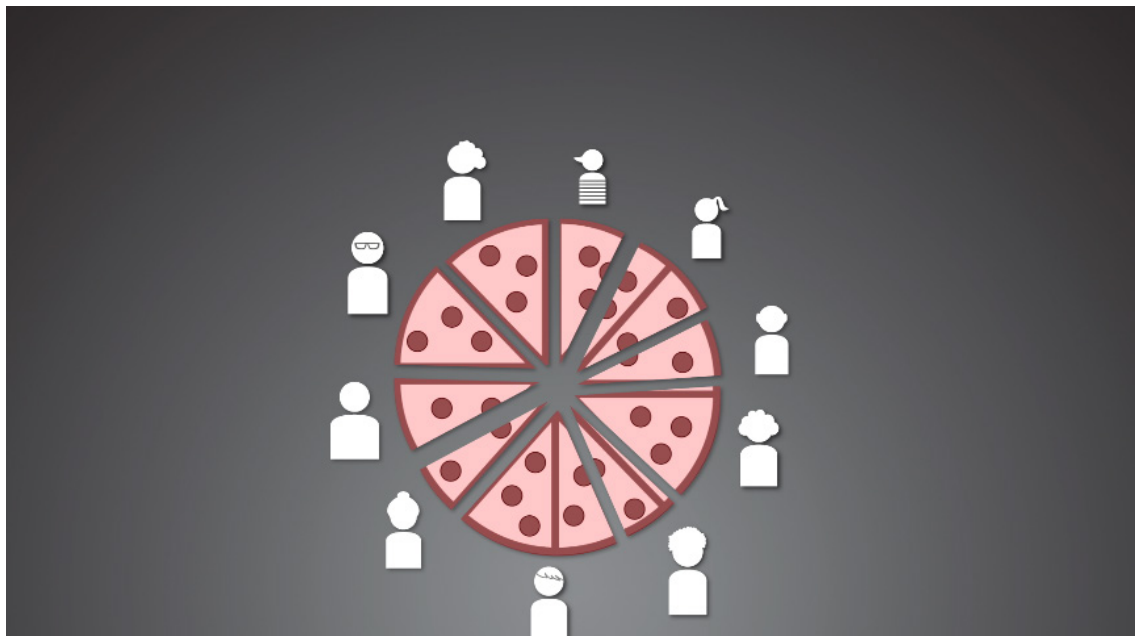
All of your Internet devices share your Verizon FiOS connection, whether you're wired or wireless.



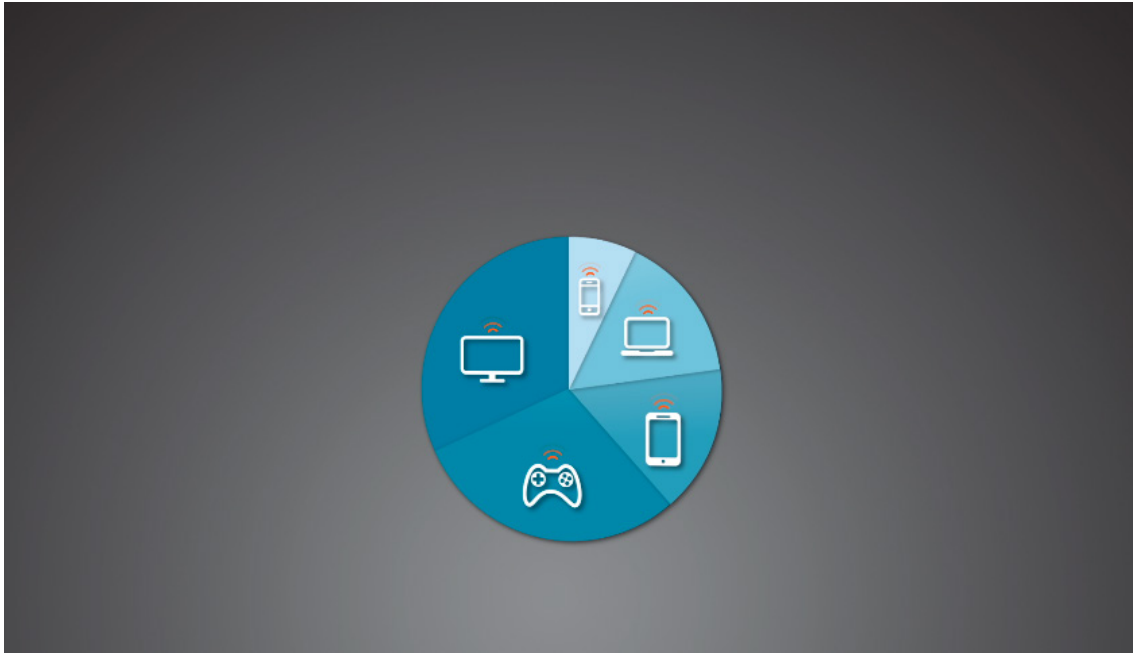
And while FiOS provides a lot of speed for bandwidth-hungry devices, you'd be surprised how fast it goes.



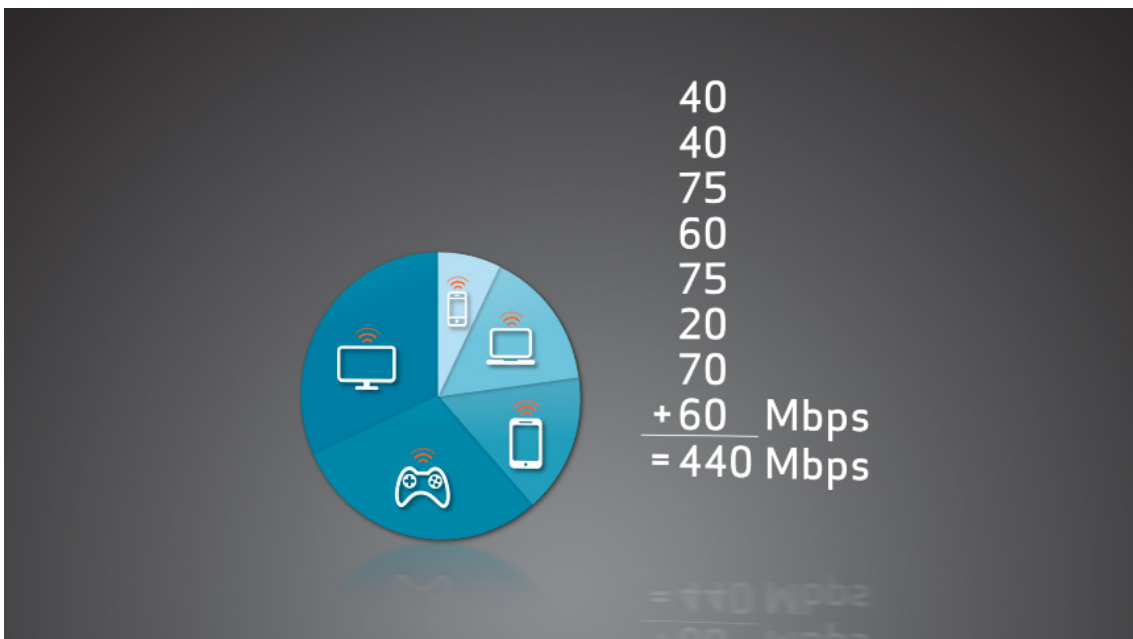

Each connected device uses a slice of your bandwidth. Over wi-fi, tablets will use between 20 Mbps and 40 Mbps, smartphones between 15 Mbps and 40 Mbps.





Laptops, televisions, and gaming systems, can take from 5 Mbps to 75 Mbps. It adds up fast.



So if your household has a lot of devices...choose a plan that keeps them running FiOS fast.



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
